### Medium

Tule, beads, leather, and pigment

## Description

Weave: Twined with full-twist overlay. Female figure using same technique and material as Klamath baskets. Starts at top of head, has added warp for arms and ends in miniature rawhide moccasins on feet. Hair area on head and band at waist are dark(mud-dyed tule) weft; two other bands around upper torso are checkerboard of alternate plain and mud-dyed weft. Flesh areas are light

brown dyed weft. Warp is added at hip line for grass-like skirt twined only at top. Orange at sides of head for earrings; beads also strung around neck. Narrow rawhide band around head.
